

Job Description: Speech-Language Pathologist

Overall Purpose:

The Speech-Language Pathologist will also provide top-notch speech/language services in a Listening and Spoken Language methodology for deaf and hard-of-hearing children as well as progress monitoring and ongoing therapy for children from birth through the end of high school. This is a year-round program. Additionally, they will be responsible for initial and ongoing evaluations and proper data collection as well as consultation with educational teams and participation in multidisciplinary evaluations. This is a year-round program.

Essential Functions:

- Provides excellent ongoing Listening and Spoken Language therapy.
- Assists with service coordination outside of the SHRC, in the community, in the school, and in home-based settings to achieve goals in all necessary areas.
- Completes comprehensive speech and language evaluations, taking responsibility for pre-linguistic and linguistic communication development.
- Provides clear and detailed reports to families and students' schools.
- Attends case conferences to report on students' evaluation data and participate as a member of the case conference committee.
- Obtains consultation from other team members in areas outside their own expertise, such as audiology, social work, cognition, and speech development, to fully address the needs of individual children on caseload.
- Communicates effectively with the audiologist to get the best outcomes from amplification including cochlear implant mappings.
- Follows all regulations set forth by Indiana's First Steps program (e.g., continuing education, paperwork, billing, credentialing).

Additional Tasks and Responsibilities:

- The SLP may be called upon to assist with Hear Indiana programs (e.g., camp, conference, Run for Sound, parent night) and assisting with training for parents and other providers.
- Will be asked to speak at or provide support at Parent INcouragement Night throughout the year.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities Needed:

- Must maintain licensure/certification and participates actively in service activities and the professional community within own discipline.
- Must be willing to obtain LSLS Certification. Cost covered by Hear Indiana.

- Ability to lift 30lbs. Frequent sitting, standing and walking.
- Computer proficiency for Microsoft Office required.
- Good planning and organizational skills.
- Well-developed interpersonal and communication skills.
- Professional appearance and manner.
- Must hold a valid Indiana driver's license and active auto insurance.

Education/Experience:

- Licensed to practice as a Speech-Language Pathologist in Indiana.
- Preference is given to those with LSLS Certification and experience working with children who are deaf or hard of hearing learning to listen and speak through the use of hearing aids and/or cochlear implants

Position Type and Expected Hours of Work:

This is a full-time 30-40 hr/week position.

Travel:

Traveling to school districts in the Indianapolis area and to families' homes, daycares, and audiology appointments throughout most of First Steps Cluster G may be required. These areas include Hamilton and Tipton Counties and NE and S Indianapolis.
